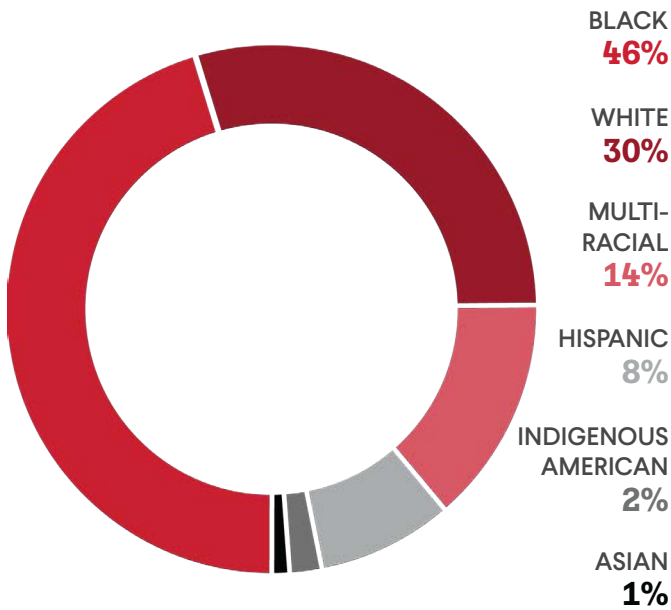

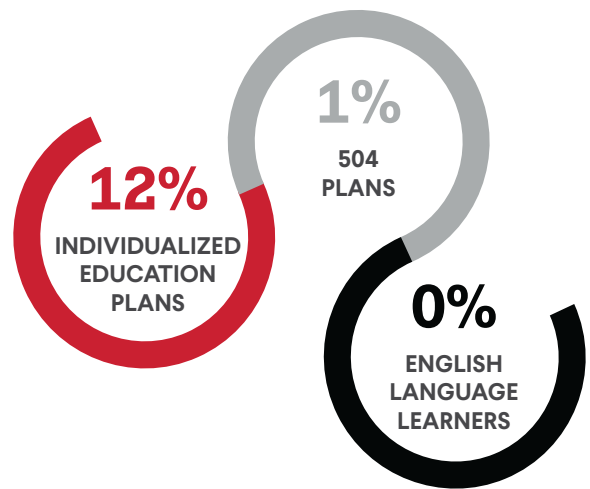

STUDENT DEMOGRAPHICS



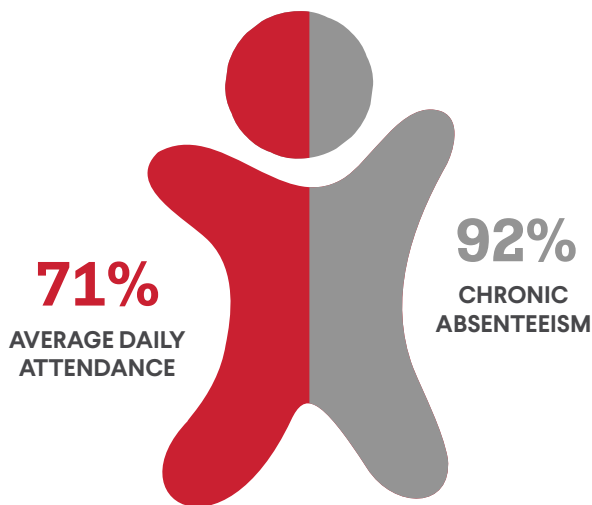

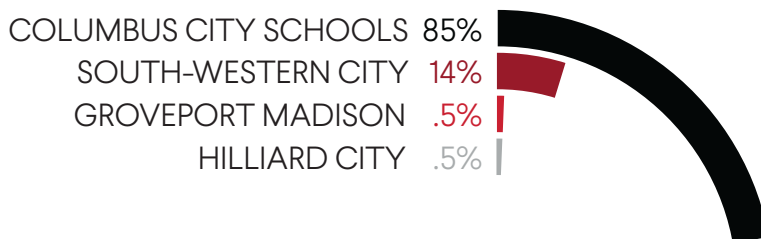

ACADEMIC PROGRESS

The academic goal of Central Point Preparatory Academy during the 2021-22 school year was to meet or exceed growth in Reading and Math as measured by the i-Ready and OST assessments. The school met the progress indicator on the 2022 Ohio State Test (3 Stars, Progress) in addition to significant increases in Reading and Math as measured by i-Ready. Central Point Preparatory Academy also increased its Performance Index (PI) Score by over 13%.

YOY GROWTH IN PERFORMANCE INDEX SCORE



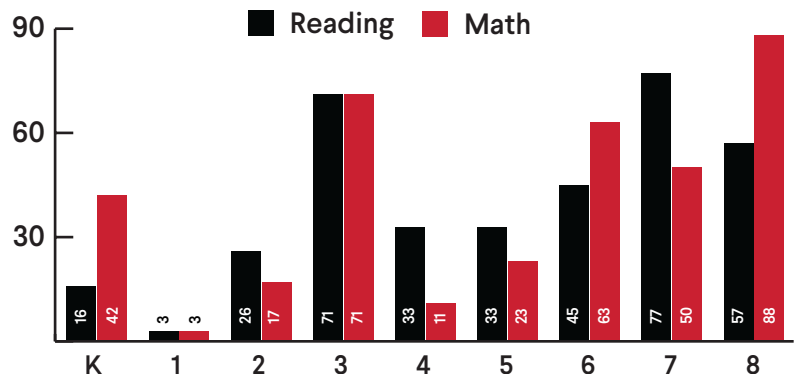
